

1. Student Leave (Short Term)

- ✓ If a student can't continue his/ her study because of illness or injury
- ✓ If a student caught an infectious disease and can influence other students' health

Sick Leave

- ✓ Participation in event hosted and recommended by President of CNU
- ✓ Legal Voting

Officially Approved Leave

- ✓ Marriage: him/herself(3 days), sons/daughters(1 day)
- ✓ Childbirth: spouse(3 days)

 mother herself(30 days)
- ✓ Death: spouse&parents(5 days)

 grandparents(3 days)

 siblings(3 days)

Compassionate Leave

- ✓ Student must fill in application (if additional documents required, prepare also) and submit to department office
- ✓ Application form will be uploaded on the website of School of International Studies

How to Apply

Additional Documents for Sick Leave

✓ Written diagnosis(MUST requirement if 6 days or more), Certificate of Hospitalization/Discharge, Medical Confirmation, Prescription for medication

Additional Documents for Compassionate Leave

✓ Certificate indicating Family Relation, Wedding Invitation, Birth Certificate, Death Certificate

Notice

✓ Attendance must be at least 2/3 of the semester, and the total of attendance and student leave period must be more than ¾ of the semester

2. Leave of Absence(6 semester possible altogether)

- ✓ Personal situation (ex) Family affair
- ✓ For international students' leave of absence, confirmation of Office of International Affairs is required
- ✓ Leave of Absence for first semester is not allowed
- ✓ Apply through CNU Integrated Information Systems

Leave of Absence(most common)

- ✓ Certificate indicating family relations (under age 8), Certificate of (expected) birth
- ✓ Student can leave school from 3 months before delivery
- ✓ Apply through CNU Integrated Information Systems

Leave of Absence(Maternity Leave)

- ✓ Documents showing the proof of illness is required
- ✓ (International Students) For students who can't enter Korea due to COVID19 (Confirmation of Office of International Affairs is Required)
- ✓ For students confirmed to be infected of infectious disease
- ✓ Exclude this period from the possible leave of absence period altogether

Leave of Absence(Illness)

Most common-tuition fee

- ✓ Release to next month: before ½ of the semester
- ✓ Refund: before ¾ of the semester

Maternity Leave-tuition fee

- ✓ Release to next month: before ½ of the semester
- ✓ Refund: before ¾ of the semester

Notice

✓ Attendance must be at least 2/3 of the semester, and the total of attendance and student leave period must be more than 3/4 of the semester

3. Academic Warning & Grading

Academic Warning

- ✓ In accordance with university policy, students failing to maintain a minimum cumulative GPA 1.75 for all work attempted at CNU will be limited to take classes.
- ✓ Students who has under 1.0 GPA (D+) will be disadvantaged in visa extension by immigration law.

Grading System

- ✓ Grading is decided on the basis of the relative evaluation, judging from the test scores, assignments and attendance.
- ✓ The grading system of CNU is as follows.

4. Issuance of Student ID Cards

- 1. Photo in the Student ID card will be the same photo in your application form (Changing the photo is not allowed)
 - > If a student wants to change the photo, he/she must visit HANA Bank in our university individually in April.
- 2. Student ID card will be issued within end of March.
 - > Students will receive SMS individually and time of receipt can vary from student by student!
- 3. Functions

E-cash(school stores, cafeterias) + Lending&Returning books at the library + International Student identity Card (ISIC) + Transportation card in Daejeon Bankbook isn't issued but if a student needs it, he/she can issue it.

- Student can issue additional check card
- ◆◆ Issuance can be done after student number is given to the students (March ~) ◆◆ Access through SMS sent by CNU, by QR scanning etc (will be re-guided later)
